

SNOW OPERATIONS

November Through April

Dear Residents and Visitors:

Welcome to Winter in the High Country! The Town of Frisco averages 200 inches of snowfall annually and has approximately 30 lane miles of streets to maintain.

The Town's primary goal during any snowstorm is to keep public streets and sidewalks open and safe for travel. Snow removal crews are well prepared for winter conditions and work around the clock if needed to clear streets, sidewalks, and alleyways during a storm.

Please read this snow removal guide to find out how we can better team up to make your winter season a safe and pleasurable one.

On Street Parking

NO PARKING

Main Street - 2:00 a.m. - 6:00 a.m.

All other Streets / Alleys / Right-of-Ways

Midnight - 6:00 a.m.

Because of the danger to both parked vehicles and snow removal equipment and personnel, there are "No Parking" restrictions on all Town right-of-ways. In the Core Area of town, there is no parking from 2 a.m. to 6 a.m. On residential streets and alleys there is a no parking restriction from midnight to 6 a.m. The Town of Frisco does have posted "No Parking" on streets and will enforce Ordinance Section 177-6 of the Traffic Code. All vehicles impeding the snow removal operations during these hours will be towed (at the owner's expense). Please help us do a better job by observing the parking restrictions on public right-of-ways.

Driveways

Our goal is to have all streets plowed by early morning for your safety on the roadways. When plowing Town streets, snow berms are sometimes created across private driveways. Removal of this snow in driveways is the responsibility of the property owner. We ask that you plow this bermed snow back onto your private property and not into the Town right-of-way.

Private Snow Plowing

Property owners should be aware that the placing, dumping, or pushing of snow onto Town streets or right-of-ways from adjacent properties is prohibited by ordinance 127-38. Please plow snow back onto your private property and not into the Town right-of-way.

Sidewalks

The Town of Frisco will provide sidewalk clearing in the Core Area of Town and a majority of the bikepaths. We do ask property owners that if

clear of snow and ice so that pedestrians can be assured of safe travel.



Questions and Answers

What does the term 'Town Right-of-Way' mean?

While the Town rights-of-way measure between 60-85 feet in width, as a general guideline the Town utilizes a minimum of 20 feet on each side of the pavement for public utilities, street maintenance, drainage, and snow storage. Citizens should be aware that snow operations require use of the full width of the asphalt and the 20 feet on each side of the street within the right-of-way.

When is it O.K. to park on my street again after it's been plowed?

The Town of Frisco does not allow on street parking from midnight to 6 a.m. We appreciate your cooperation in waiting until the street has been completely plowed to the full width. This typically requires a minimum of two passes by our plows to get the job completed.

Why don't you just tow cars that don't observe the parking restrictions?

We try, but it's very time consuming. It involves coordination of the Street Division, Police Department, and a towing company. If there's a car on your street that's never moved, call the Police Department at 668-5276 from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. weekdays. Call 668-3579 after 5 p.m. on weekdays and on weekends and holidays. The Police Department will put notices on offending vehicles when possible to alert those who must move, minimizing the need to ticket or tow.

I'm very concerned about the environment: Why don't you do more plowing and eliminate the use of all the sand and salt?

Plowing and sanding don't serve the same purpose. It's very important for safety that both are done during a snowfall. We use a low ratio of salt to sand and we try to sweep the streets as soon as weather permits, minimizing airborne particulate matter (PM10). The Town of Frisco uses a maximum of 5% salt to sand. Over the past several years, we have reduced the use of salt and sand by 50%. In the commercial area of town, in intersections, on bus routes, and on problem hills, a vegetable-based liquid de-icer has been used with much success. This de-icer helps alleviate some of the environmental issues that come with the use of abrasives.

Who can I call if I've got a complaint or a request?

For snow plowing or sanding operations call 668-0836. For parked or abandoned vehicles call 668-5276 from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. weekdays. Call 668-3579 after 5:00 p.m. weekdays and on weekends and holidays.

Can't the Town remove the snow they put in my driveway?

When you consider the number of driveways in town, it would logistically impossible. Our primary duty is to keep the public streets, intersections, and sidewalks safe, with a typical storm taking crews 10-12 hours to complete!



Following are the priorities for snow removal:

#1 Main Street and the Central Core Area - **RED**

Due to the volume of pedestrian and vehicular traffic, "Bare pavement" is the goal in the Core Area. Snow is first removed from the sidewalks to the parking areas and then plowed to the centerline of Main Street. The snowpile is then blown into trucks with a snowblower and hauled to designated snow storage areas.

#2 Residential Streets - **BLUE**

Residential streets are plowed immediately after Main Street with emphasis on schools, fire station, bus routes, stop signs, hills, curves, and intersections. Snow is plowed onto the street rights of way when accumulations reach four inches or more. This usually takes multiple passes by the plow to get the job done completely.

#3 Alleys -----

The Core Area alleys of town are normally plowed first, followed by the residential area. This includes THROUGH alleys only.

#4 Dead-end and/or Unimproved Alleys

These alleys do not receive regular winter maintenance, but will be plowed after the storm cycle as time and manpower permits. We want to emphasize that plowing of these alleys may not occur until well after the storm cycle.


Note: Summit Boulevard is maintained by the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT).


