

HOW TO OBTAIN A BUILDING PERMIT FOR REPAIRS/REMODELS

THE PURPOSE OF THE PERMIT PROCESS

The permit process is in place to help assure that new building construction and repairs or alterations meet minimum standards for safeguarding life, limb, health, property and public welfare through affordability, as these buildings and additions are used and occupied.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT OFFICES

You may apply for permits at the Building Department which is located on the second floor of the Frisco Town Hall at One West Main Street. The Building Department hours of operation are 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. Monday through Friday.

APPLYING FOR PERMITS

All projects must fill out a Building Department Permit Application Form. This form requires general information such as location of the project, owner of the property, the contractor performing the work, a brief description of the work and a valuation of the proposed work. An application for the building permit for repairs and remodels requires one (1) set of plans, stamped by a Colorado licensed architect or engineer, to be submitted with the application. Plan review fees are due at the time of application for a building permit. The typical time to process a building permit is 5 to 14 days, varying with the department's workload at the time the application is submitted, type of project, and quality of the plans submitted.

APPLICATION FOR ELECTRICAL PERMITS

If any electrical work is needed, an electrical permit must first be obtained. All electrical permits for electrical work in the Town of Frisco are issued by the Summit County Building Department, which is located in the County Commons Building, just south of Frisco at 0037 County Road 1005. Their telephone number is 970-668-3170. Generally, all electrical work must be performed by a licensed electrician.

PLAN REVIEW REQUIREMENTS

The plans and drawings must be drawn to scale, dimensioned, legible, and accurate. The plans must be stamped by a licensed architect or engineer. The submitted plans must at a minimum contain the following information:

- Site plan showing property lines and building location
- Floor plans with complete dimensions (showing existing and proposed)
- Building elevations of all four sides (if exterior changes are proposed)
- Foundation plan with complete dimensions (if new foundation is to be added)
- Section view details of footings and foundation walls (where applicable)
- Framing plans of each floor and roof
- Framing details
- Energy conservation information
- General notes specifying species and grade of all wood framing members and assumed soil bearing pressure.

OTHER AGENCIES HAVING JURISDICTION

As part of applying for a building permit, you will be given an Agency Sign-Off Card. You will be responsible for taking this card to the agencies indicated on the card to get a sign-off indicating approval for a permit to be issued. These agencies might include:

- Town of Frisco Planning Department 668-5276
- Summit County Environmental Health Dept. 668-4070

Please be aware that these agencies may require an inspection, fees, or posting of notice prior to giving their approval for issuance of the building permit.

FOUNDATION ONLY PERMITS

All permits for new building construction are first issued as a Conditional Permit. This Conditional Permit limits the authorized work to construction of the footings and foundation. The contractor is then responsible for getting an Improvement Location Certificate by a licensed surveyor, or an inspection by the Town of Frisco Planning Department. That survey or inspection is to verify the location of the footings and foundation are on the property and its setback from property lines and easements. The survey or inspection must be approved by the Planning Department before a full building permit can be issued and must be approved before proceeding with framing.

INSPECTIONS

Requests for inspections require notice by 4:30 PM the business day prior to the desired day of inspection. Inspections may be requested by calling 668-5276 Option 1. All electrical inspection requests must be scheduled with the Summit County Building Department.

CERTIFICATES OF OCCUPANCY/COMPLETION

After all final inspections are completed and approved, the department can proceed with issuing the Certificate of Occupancy/Completion for that project. The process for issuing the Certificate of Occupancy/Completion begins when you turn in the Inspection Record Card and the Agency Sign-Off Card with final approvals from the indicated agencies. This typically will require you to return to those same agencies which you visited for a sign-off to get your original building permit. Please be aware that these agencies may require an inspection or fees prior to giving their approval for a Certificate of Occupancy.
