
Project team members will be available to answer questions.

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Special Considerations

Expect lane switches early in Phase One construction.

Phase One (2016 Season): Anticipate traffic in a two-lane configuration on the new alignment by Winter Shutdown November 2016.

Working hours: Monday through Saturday, 7:00am to 6:00pm. No impacts to traffic during Saturday operations.

Traffic Delays: Motorists could anticipate 20 additional minutes added to the commute through the project.

Bike Path Strategy: The bike path will remain open 100% of the time. Bike detours will be constructed. Anticipate flaggers on the path.

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Colorado Highway 9 Iron Springs Project

The Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) and SEMA Construction expects to begin road improvements on Monday, May 16th, on CO 9 on the Iron Springs location. The project length is approximately 2 (two) miles.

The major realignment will consist of a new four lane highway to allow a better commute on CO 9 from Frisco to Breckenridge. This new alignment will consist of three new culverts, with landscaped retaining walls, to allow cyclists and pedestrians easy access throughout the bike trail. Traffic will only be affected on the South and North ends of the project. Temporary pavement will be installed at each end to allow proper realignment of the highway. Two-way traffic will be accessible at all times.

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
