## About the NCS™

The National Community Survey™ report is about the "livability" of Frisco. The phrase "livable community" is used here to evoke a place that is not simply habitable, but that is desirable. It is not only where people do live, but where they want to live.

Great communities are partnerships of the government, private sector, community-based organizations and residents, all geographically connected. The NCS captures residents' opinions considering ten central facets of a community:

- Economy
- Mobility
- Community Design
- Utilities
- Safety
- Natural Environment
- Parks and Recreation
- Health and Wellness
- Education, Arts and Culture
- Inclusivity & Engagement



The Community Livability Report provides the opinions of a sample of 731 homeowners in the Town of Frisco. The margin of error around any reported percentage is 4% for all respondents and the response rate for the 2020 survey was 44%. The full description of methods used to garner these opinions can be found in the *Technical Appendices* provided under separate cover.

## **Overview of Results**

#### Frisco is a desirable place to live.

Almost all respondents (97%) positively scored the overall quality of life in Frisco, Frisco as a place to live (97%), and the overall image or reputation of the town (96%). These ratings were higher than the national benchmarks. About 9 in 10 were likely to recommend living in Frisco to someone who asked and planned to remain in the town for the next five years.

## Respondents are pleased with Community Design but see affordable housing as an area for improvement.

About 8 in 10 community members assigned favorable reviews to the overall design or layout of Frisco's residential and commercial area and indicated that it was an essential or important focus area for the community to address in the coming years. Roughly 9 in 10 respondents gave high marks to the overall appearance of Frisco, their neighborhood as a place to live, and public places where people want to spend time; these scores were above the national averages. Similar to other comparison communities nationwide, about 6 in 10 favorably rated the overall quality of new development in Frisco, well-planned residential and commercial growth, well-designed neighborhoods, code enforcement, and land use, planning, and zoning. However, only 15% of community members evaluated the availability of affordable quality housing as excellent or good, which was lower than the national benchmark. About 8 in 10 survey participants felt that increasing workforce housing units was an essential or very important focus for Frisco

## Survey participants applaud the Natural Environment and prioritize environmental sustainability.

About 9 in 10 respondents indicated that the overall quality of the natural environment in Frisco was essential or very important for the community to focus on in the next two years. Almost all favorably assessed the overall quality of the natural environment in Frisco (97%), cleanliness (96%), and air quality (98%), while 8 in 10 gave high marks to preservation of natural areas; these ratings were higher than those observed in comparison communities. About 9 in 10 survey participants positively reviewed water resources in Frisco. About 8 in 10 respondents indicated that environmental sustainability (100% renewable energy, water/energy conservation, electronic vehicles, etc.) should be a high or medium priority for the Town to address in the near future.

#### Community members value Parks and Recreation in Frisco.

About 9 in 10 survey participants gave high scores to the overall quality of parks and recreation opportunities in Frisco. Respondents' evaluations of the availability of paths and walking trails, recreational opportunities, and fitness opportunities were higher than the national benchmarks. Assessments of Town parks and recreation programs or classes were on par with comparison communities. At least 7 in 10 respondents indicated that improvements to neighborhood parks, Frisco Bay Marina, and Frisco Peninsula Recreation Area/Adventure Park were a high or medium priority for the Town in the coming years.

## **Facets of Livability**

Ratings of importance were compared to ratings of quality to help guide Town staff and officials with decisions on future resource allocation and strategic planning areas. When competition for limited resources demands that efficiencies or cutbacks be instituted, it is wise not only to know what facets are deemed most important to residents' quality of life, but which among the most important are perceived to be of relatively lower quality in your community. It is these facets of community livability – more important facets perceived as being of lower quality – to which attention needs to be paid first.

To identify the facets perceived by residents to have relatively lower quality at the same time as relatively higher importance, the national benchmark comparisons for quality and importance ratings were compared for each. The upper left-hand quadrant contains those facets of higher importance but lower quality, and may be considered as areas of focus for the entire community of Frisco.


#### FIGURE 2: IMPORTANCE OF FACETS OF LIVABILITY- SUMMARY

#### FIGURE 3: QUALITY OF LIFE IN FRISCO




FIGURE 4: QUALITY OF LIFE IN FRISCO - SUMMARY


#### FIGURE 5: RECOMMEND FRISCO - SUMMARY

#### **OVERALL CONFIDENCE IN GOVERNMENT**









FIGURE 7: GOVERNMENT PERFORMANCE AND SERVICES - SUMMARY




FIGURE 9: ECONOMIC HEALTH - SUMMARY



#### FIGURE 13: USE OF ALTERNATIVE TRANSPORTATION MODES




FIGURE 14: MOBILITY IN FRISCO - SUMMARY



## THE OVERALL DESIGN OR LAYOUT OF RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL AREAS







FIGURE 17: COMMUNITY DESIGN - SUMMARY



#### **FIGURE 18: UTILITES**





#### FIGURE 20: SAFETY IN FRISCO




FIGURE 21: SAFETY-RELATED SERVICES - SUMMARY




FIGURE 24: NATURAL ENVIRONMENT - SUMMARY

#### **FIGURE 25: PARKS AND RECREATION**






FIGURE 26: PARKS AND RECREATION - SUMMARY







FIGURE 29: EDUCATION, ARTS AND CULTURE


FIGURE 30: EDUCATION, ARTS AND CULTURE - SUMMARY


## **Inclusivity and Engagement**

#### **RESIDENTS' CONNECTION AND ENGAGEMENT** WITH THEIR COMMUNITY






FIGURE 32: INCLUSIVITY & ENGAGEMENT - SUMMARY

#### FIGURE 33: RESIDENTS' PARTICIPATION LEVELS




FIGURE 34: RESIDENTS' PARTICIPATION IN LAST 12 MONTHS- SUMMARY





FIGURE 37: SOURCES OF TOWN INFORMATION
