

# Construction & Demolition Waste Programs

2023 initiatives underway:

- Pallet grinder demo May 9
- Vert Sites working with 3 contractors on pilot
- C&D data tracking for contractors underway at SCRAP
- Summer concrete crushing at SCRAP
- SCRAP/HC3 to meet with SCG staff re: ordinance and stakeholder engagement





# Food Scrap Program

- 2,947 total people enrolled (503 with Frisco zip codes)
- 194,760 lbs diverted in Q1-2 (66% increase over last year)
- Annual compost giveaway with SCRAP took place in May





# Recycling Outreach


- Recycling Open House in June (Frisco)
- Oops Tags: 30 routes June-September (1 in Frisco)
- Stump the Experts: 18 sessions June-September (6 in Frisco)
- 10 Businesses received Strong Future minigrants (2 in Frisco, unrelated to Pay as You Throw)




# Marketing

- Promoted glass and food scrap recycling in spring (informed by visitor survey)
- Website traffic down, time on site and pages viewed per visit is up
- Summer messages: general guidelines + specific items (egg cartons, 6-pack holders, plastic bags)









# Universal Recycling

- 43 Businesses/HOAs assisted with Universal Recycling (13 in Frisco) in 2023 alone
- Developed/executing Universal Recycling Outreach plan for proactive calls, emails and visits
- Success: The Towers avoided costs of a new waste enclosure by working with HC3 and hauler





# Pay as You Throw


- Hosted April 5 in-person for Frisco residents and virtual workshop in May
- Frisco resident bin delivery in September
- Regularly answer resident questions and liaise with waste haulers
- Marketing May-June and August

### **2022** Accomplishments

- 6 Frisco residents went solar
- 100+ attendees at annual EV Ride and Drive
- 4 Myth-Busting videos featuring local EV drivers
- 4 building professional workshops
- \$75,000 EPA grant for Climate Equity Plan
- Renewable Energy Mitigation Program development





### Climate Action

#### **2023 Progress**

- Climate Equity Plan community engagement
- 7 more Frisco residents Solarized
- Heat pump workshops for residents and contractors
- Electric car videos on TV and new induction stove and electric snowblower videos
- Updated building decarbonization strategies
- Climate Action Week: October 2 6
- Renewable Energy Mitigation Program adopted in Breckenridge

## Energy Smart Colorado

#### **2022 Success**

- 32 energy assessments completed (goal: 25)
- 10 energy efficiency upgrades completed (goal: 10)
- Annual average energy bill savings:
  \$342 per household
- Cumulative greenhouse gas emissions savings:
  125 metric tons / year

### 2023 Progress

- 27/25 home energy assessments + 7/10 home energy retrofits more scheduled!
- \$4,000 in rebates for locals earning up to 160% AMI





### Sustainable Business

#### **2022 Success**

- 8 business assessments completed (goal: 8)
- 6 business improvement projects completed (goal: 6)
- Annual energy bill savings / business: \$762
- Cumulative greenhouse gas emissions savings:
  66.5 metric tons / year

#### **2023 Progress**

- 8/8 new businesses enrolled
- 2/6 projects completed
- Business walks with Xcel Energy
