



## Which Program Elements Appeal to you?


### Court Configuration – Replace Both Tennis Courts



- Replace slab with post tensioned concrete
- Improve space between courts for user comfort and to avoid user conflict
- Replace tennis fencing, nets, and add practice wall
- Tennis court plaza space (outside of courts)
- Tennis court sign-up/reservation board
- Seating/benches with shade structure between courts

Estimate \$500,000 - \$600,000

### Circulation & Park Access



- Main entry off N. 6th Ave with wide concrete walkway
- Park identity sign at 6th & Galena
- Formalize secondary access midblock on Galena
- Wetland boardwalks with bench and interpretive signage
- Soft surface paths (decomposed granite 24" to 48" wide)
- Head-in parking on 6th Ave (6 parking spaces total – 1 ADA van)
- Crosswalk murals at 6th and Galena to highlight connections to park. Local artist collaboration

Estimate \$450,000 - \$550,000

### Community Gathering Space



- Plaza space with seasonal shade element (tensile fabric shade sail that can be removed in winter)
- Built-in seat wall
- Flexible space for additional site furnishings or small events

Estimate \$50,000 - \$75,000

### Support Features & Infrastructure



- Vegetated buffer along north edge to screen noise and activity
- Park restrooms – year-round access with drinking fountain/ water bottle filler
- Site amenities: bike racks, trash and recycling containers
- Large fence opening at tennis courts to leave open in winter for non-tennis winter use or during the summer for misc. programming (movies in the park, fitness/dance classes, etc.)
- Visual barriers (low post and cable fence) and info signage to protect wetland areas

Estimate \$115,000 - \$130,000

### Passive Park Zone



- Picnic tables and grills nestled among the existing trees
- Benches located along paths

Estimate \$10,000 - \$20,000


### Stormwater Management Methods



- Utilize landscape buffer on north and east sides for stormwater management
- Collect runoff from paved areas (courts, park entry promenade and plaza space) and direct to infiltration areas

Estimate \$25,000 - \$35,000

### Discovery Play and Nature Play Nodes



- Nature based discover play nodes along park paths to encourage intergenerational play and engagement (stumps, logs, mud, benches, games, etc.)
- Play hut located on the peninsula

Estimate \$80,000 - \$100,000





## Which Program Elements Appeal to you?

### Court Configuration – Keep One Tennis Courts + Convert One Court to Multi-Use



- Replace court with reinforced concrete
- Dedicated tennis plaza / access on east side of courts with reservations board and seating area
- Replace tennis court fencing (tall fencing on three sides, tall and low fencing adjacent to new basketball court)
- Full court basketball, soccer nets, four square striping
- Multi-use court has minimal fencing for circulation
- Seat wall and vegetation screen the parking area and collect stray balls

Estimate \$500,000 - \$565,000

### Circulation & Park Access



- Parking in front of courts (~8 parking spots)
- Park Identity/signage and primary at 6th Ave
- Secondary entry from 5th Ave alley
- Existing wetland area is preserved
- Short post and rail fence prevents access to wetlands
- Soft surface path (decomposed granite), connects across site
- Traffic calming intersection murals and pedestrian node murals done by local artist

Estimate \$200,000 - \$250,000

### Community Gathering Space



- Position to take advantage of mountain view
- Connect to multi-sport court for use as gathering, waiting, resting related to court play
- Soft surface (decomposed granite) courtyard with seat walls and boulders
- Small water feature inspired by site's history as Town well

Estimate \$75,000 - \$90,000

### Support Features & Infrastructure



- Restrooms – year round access with one unisex restroom
- Extended shed roof provides shaded seating
- Seat wall, drinking fountain, bike rack and waste bins centrally located
- Open access to multi-use court on west side and north side allow the court to be used for other community events and encourage winter use
- Screening fence along northern park boundary

Estimate \$125,000 - \$150,000

### Passive Park Zone



- Picnic tables & grills
- Naturalized seating areas
- Interpretive signage corresponds with wetland area

Estimate \$15,000 - \$20,000

### Stormwater Management Methods



- LID techniques – incorporate small infiltration areas throughout site
- Bioretention / rain gardens collect runoff from court spaces
- Investigate permeable paving alternatives for parking area

Estimate \$25,000 - \$35,000

### Nature Playground + Discovery Play Area




- Large play area, features for a broad range of ages
- Play elements made of natural materials and provide a sculptural aesthetic
- Hammock garden for wide range of users
- Discovery play area for with water, mud, and other natural materials to inspire creative nature-based engagement
- Water play element: water pump, water chute (near gathering area and in reference to the historic spring)

Estimate \$300,000 - \$330,000

## Which Program Elements Appeal to you?


### Court Configuration – Keep One Tennis Court & Convert One to Multi-Use & Gathering Space



- Replace surface with reinforced slab, new practice wall
- Replace all fencing (tall fence on all sides, shorter fence at mid court, no fence around basketball court)
- Multi-use court: half basketball court, striped for other games (bike/walking maze, hopscotch, foursquare, etc.)
- Alternative games area could be soft surface and include horseshoes, or cornhole, vertical board games
- Open circulation and connection to play areas and gathering space

Estimate \$425,000 - \$475,000

### Circulation & Park Access



- Parking along 6th Ave (~8 parking spots, 1 ADA)
- Multiple small pedestrian access points
- Park Identity/signage at 6th Ave and Galena. Main park entrances from 6th Ave and Galena
- Existing wetland area becomes park space for walking trails. Dirt path nature trail (18" wide) minimizes footprint within wetland area
- Network of soft surface paths (decomposed granite) and hardscape paths (concrete), 48" wide
- Traffic calming crosswalks at 6th Ave and Galena. Local artist

Estimate \$205,000 - \$250,000

### Community Gathering Space



- Partially covered plaza space with permanent shade structure
- Position to take advantage of mountain views
- Connect to multi-sport court and tennis court for use as gathering and waiting/resting related to court play
- Permeable paver patio with site furnishings
- Sculpture by local artist to represent Frisco's history
- Boulders shared with Discovery play
- Small courtyard near restrooms for drinking fountain, bike parking, and seating

Estimate \$120,000 - \$150,000

### Support Features & Infrastructure



- Restrooms – year round access with two unisex restrooms centrally located for courts, playgrounds and gathering spaces
- Drinking fountain with water bottle filler and bike parking near restroom
- Electrical services for small special events
- Extra wide gate on west side of tennis court to leave open for winter uses and other community events
- Vegetative screening along northern park boundary
- Wetland interpretive signage along nature trail. Park identity sign at main entrances

Estimate \$115,000 - \$150,000

### Passive Park Zone



- Minimal picnic tables & grills in natural area in order to encourage path use and vegetation restoration
- Tree deck or spiral bench by Bienenstock
- Space for hook and ring games or other similar small footprint games
- Interpretive signage and benches along nature path
- Boardwalks to protect existing vegetation and to access peninsula

Estimate \$10,000 - \$15,000

### Stormwater Management Methods



- LID techniques throughout site
- Bioretention basins to collect and infiltrate runoff
- Subgrade drywell within parking area

Estimate \$25,000 - \$35,000

### Nature Playground + Discovery Play Area



- Medium size play area integrated with existing trees
- Iconic nature play feature with log steppers and hammock space. Features for a broad range of ages
- Play elements made of natural materials provide a sculptural aesthetic
- Discovery play area with a small Alpine Hut, varied textures and natural materials to inspire creative nature based engagement
- Connection to peninsula with small area for nature exploration
- Planting restoration to improve shade and feeling of being enclosed by nature

Estimate \$190,000 - \$225,000







## Which Program Elements Appeal to you?

### Court Configuration – Single Tennis Court



- Replace surface with new post tension slab and rotate layout slightly to align with adjacent roads
- New basketball hoops (2) without striping, varying heights
- Replace all tennis fencing, install new nets, reservation system and practice wall
- Double gate access to courtyard for maintenance or other events

Estimate \$310,000 - \$325,000

### Circulation & Park Access



- Parallel parking on 6th Ave and along alley (8 total spaces)
- Primary pedestrian entrance at Galena - mid block
- Intersection mural allowing for diagonal pedestrian connection from 602 Galena
- Bike lane mural to improve pedestrian / bicycle visibility
- Boardwalks through wetlands in limited locations
- Access from 5th Ave to peninsula or onto park path

Estimate \$375,000 - \$400,000

### Community Gathering Space



- Large gathering space framed by trellis on southwest side
- Circular bench seating
- Integrate art and storytelling into paving and seating elements (i.e. animal tracks, patterns)
- Space for movable, furniture, park games, etc.
- Ample space and seating for small community workshops, classes, and gatherings

Estimate \$125,000 - \$150,000

### Support Features & Infrastructure



- Restroom building with drinking fountain and water bottle filler (4 stalls & storage room)
- Extra wide gate on west side of tennis court to leave open for winter uses and other community events. Gate to align with community gathering space
- Park landscaping to include aspen understory gardens, pollinator gardens and native perennials to complement existing native wildflowers

Estimate \$125,000 - \$150,000

### Passive Park Zone



- Naturalized area for picnic tables and grills
- Nature nook and nature viewing area on peninsula
- Bird boxes or bug boxes mounted on posts: artistic expression and bird habitat
- Interpretive signage corresponds with on site habitat

Estimate \$20,000 - \$30,000

### Active Park Zone & Stormwater Management Methods



- Fitness structure, natural materials single unit with multiple uses
- Utilize landscape buffer and parking area on north side of property to collect run-off for infiltration
- LID techniques spread throughout site
- Bioretention basin collects court runoff for infiltration

Estimate \$45,000 - \$60,000

### Discovery Play / Nature Playground



- Iconic nature play structure, play hammock, integrated with existing trees
- Play elements made of natural materials to blend with existing vegetation
- Connection to shaded seating area / trellis and fitness area to accommodate adults supervising playground
- Playground border constructed with stumps and logs as additional play elements

Estimate \$380,000 - \$400,000

## General Comments
