June 19, 2026 Minutes

- Approval of May 1, 2026, Meeting Minutes
- Member Updates
 - Colorado Creative Industries Summit – Jamie Callahan attended and said it was quite good. He commented that Trinidad is up-and-coming, and it was interesting to see their revitalization efforts. Well attended and some breakouts were better than others. This conference will now be bi-annual, and the next one will be in Estes Park in 2028.

Jamie met a grant writer who is willing to work with the FACC, and the FACC would benefit from speaking with them and having them provide some guidance on what could be feasible for grant funding- what type of projects qualify. Jamie also met a mosaic artist who he will meet with on July 7 when they are at their family home in Breckenridge. This mosaic artist is interested in taking a look at the wall at the Frisco Old Town Hall park and potentially even teaching a class and then doing a large public art project. Jamie was not sure about her experience with outdoor mosaics, and Blair is going to ask the art conservators to provide guidance on how to make a mosaic more resilient in this environment.

Jamie also met a marble sculptor who invited him to Marble to check out their work. FACC members thought this was interesting and might be an interesting thing to offer as an educational opportunity. Might be interesting to have them in Frisco for Fall Fest to do some demos and hands on intros to this in addition to the Historic Park providing the history around how materials from Marble Colorado have been used.

- Groucho Dinner Club- Daymon- Chance for small private dinners around conversation and connection, usually around artistic topics and in restaurants. It is a software platform- <https://mygroucho.club/>. Able to facilitate, but not execute. Blair will send out the link and put this on a future agenda for more discussion.
- FACC want to discuss supporting an improv event at a future meeting. Jamie has a contact from Boulder who runs improv workshops.
- Staff Updates
 - Pacific Coast cleaning will be in Frisco from July 22-26 to work on cleaning and repair of the current public art inventory.
 - Movie Night- Sandlot is now in a 20% lead. FACC said we should close voting and start advertising the movie and movie night more actively. DJ Landry will be playing, and we can ask him to match some of the music to the movie. We will have two fire pits. There are currently three food trucks committed, but staff are working on more; this has been tough though. Food vendors will close at 7:45pm and only snack and beverage vendors will be open for the movie so there will be no generators on during the movie. Vanessa to reach to Lua about a blanket donation and sales tent. Blair to reach out to the movie licensing to secure the Sandlot movie license; he has already been in conversation with them.
 - 150 Banners- the banners are up on Main Street. There is one more banner still coming. The Colorado 150 Commission is also requested to collaborate on Frisco's banner reel on Instagram.
 - Fourth of July Stipends- \$500 to bike decorating contest which will be noted in all advertising. There were five \$1,000 stipends and one \$500 stipend approved for the July 4th parade.
 - Tunnel mural repair- Painter looked at it and feels that most is adhering well, but that this area needs to be ground and "roughed up" and re-painted. Working on getting on the schedule with the painter.
 - Elk statue (*I'm the Boss* by Stephen LeBlanc) relocation- Pacific Coast will take a look to assist us with figuring out how to best affix it to the concrete pad which will likely be poured this summer at the Frisco Adventure Park in the landscape island between the Frisco Adventure Park and Slopeside Hall.
- Projects
 - Wassail Mug 2026- Going with the 3rd choice for the mug design, as the second choice cannot work within the budget for mug design. Have already given direction that we don't want moose or the Frisco clock. FACC would like to give the artist a lot of freedom and just let them know that should be "wintery, unique, and not necessarily aligned with past designs".

- PRA Mural- Blair has put together an RFP, which should close August 9 and FACC will review at the August meeting to select an artist. Jamie provided the Fort Collins mural project contact, and Daymon reminded us to include a mural artist that he had provided info for; staff will update the list in the mass email list. RFP suggests \$12,700 for this mural. FACC would like us to not ask for any conceptual designs, as this requires unpaid design work. Keep design direct fairly broad in the request for qualifications.
